

North Church Youth Engaged In Work Project

Four Senior High Fellowship members of North Presbyterian Church will leave Saturday for a two week "Youth Study and Service Tour" in Vineland, N. J.

They will be accompanied by their pastor, the Rev. Frank E. Wright, who will be with them during the first week.

Using the experience they have gained as staff members of the Vacation Church School now in its final week at North Church, Rilla Sparks, Helen Mavis, Jill Knezovich and Thomas Clasper will help to conduct a similar school for Spanish-American migrant children in Vineland.

They will be joined by seven senior high young people and four adults from Wayside Presbyterian Church, Hamburg, in the service and work project.


The North Church group has attended two weekend retreats at the Wayside Church in preparation for the tour experience. In Vineland they will be housed in the Methodist Church and the school will be held in the Presbyterian Church.

Side trips to points of local interest are planned and recreational time will include visits to the seaside beaches and swimming in the ocean. The trip to and from Vineland will be by chartered bus.

Started in 1936 by the Presbyterian Church in the USA and promoted globally by the National Council of Churches by 1940, this observance underscores the interconnectedness of Christian congregations irrespective of geographical and denominational boundaries.

As people partake in Communion, they remember that despite differences in practices and interpretations, they are all followers of Christ and members of a global family.


